TRANSLATION OF THE MORE IMPORTANT PARTS
OF THE ABOVE.

BY THE REV. REGINALD F. BIGG-WITHER, M.A.

WYMERING. The customary tenants of the same.

FREE TENANTS. The *Prior of Southwick* holds six acres of land, and pays for the same five shillings yearly on the feast of St. Michael before 9 a.m. at Wymering, and if he fails to pay before 9 a.m., he shall pay after 9, and on the following day, ten shillings.

John de Horsye holds forty-eight acres of land and pays for the same twenty-four shillings yearly on the aforesaid feast. And he makes suit to the Court every three weeks. And at his death the lord shall have his best horse with harness, viz., saddle, bridle, and sword, and if he shall possess no horse the lord shall have his best ox, and if he shall possess no cattle the lord shall have his best moveable chattel. And his heir shall pay to the lord twenty-four shillings as relief.

The *Vicar of Wymering* holds ten acres of land by paying for the same three shillings yearly on the aforesaid feast in lieu of all service.

John Fostebury holds sixty acres of land by paying for the same on the aforesaid feast twelve shillings yearly. And he shall make suit, and shall give heriot and relief as the said *John de Horsye*.

WYMERING.

Inquiry must be made concerning the making of hurdles by the tenants of *Hilsea*, who hold of Wymering....They say that they themselves of Hilsea will make hurdles, viz., each tenant by himself one hurdle and so on.

Item: whether *Juliana*, daughter of Wilfrid and Alicia *Ray* shall pay Hechyn silver.

Item: *Alice*, a ward, holds two acres of workland more than William Smyth and does not pay nor do service more than the said William. Inquiry therefore must be made.

Inquiry must be made of *P. de Waltham* concerning eightpence for the rent of the tenement once belonging to Robert atte Zerd.

Memorandum that two acres of Salterne (Marsh) land which *Richard Shepherd* held are in the hands of the lord who will pay two pence towards Salterne silver which belonged to the said Richard is in the hands of the lord and he will pay twelve pence rent annually.

HILSEA.

TENANTS *Ralph atte Rys* holds one messuage and twenty acres of land in villeinage and pays for the same yearly on the feast of S. Michael nine shillings and for two acres Saltern silvers twelve pence farthing, viz., on the feast of S. Martin fourpence three farthings, on the feast of the Nativity of the blessed John threepence three farthings, and on the feast of S. Michael three pence three farthings, and at Easter twenty eggs worth one penny, and he shall plough one acre for wheat and one acre for oats and shall receive for the said labour four pence, viz., one penny for half an acre and it is worth

sixpence clear. [And he shall plough half an acre for wheat and half an acre for oats at a price and he shall hold it from the lord for the table of the lord and it is worth three pence clear.] And he shall find one man and one horse for harrowing all the lord's arable land under crops except barley until the whole is harrowed and it is estimated that it can be done in five days in the year and it is worth five pence a year at the rate of a penny a day. And he shall find one man for four days for reaping the lord's corn and he shall receive each day from which ought to be made fifteen loaves per bushel and pottage once and two herrings and a half and a moiety of and this is worth fourpence clear. And he shall find one man for harvest work, and he shall have his own refreshment ["poturam"] at 9 o'clock, and in the evening he shall have and it is worth clear one penny. And he shall help to tie and bind all kinds of the lord's corn without refreshment, and it is estimated days and the work is worth three pence. And he shall help to carry the lord's corn when it is necessary with a cart, one man and one horse and 9 o'clock and he shall have his own repast *without drink* at 9 o'clock, and if he carry after 9 o'clock once they shall receive nothing and if twice he shall receive over and above, or two sheaves of the same corn that he carries, and he is expected to do the carrying in three days and a half and that carrying is worth clear six pence or two pence a day. And he shall help to rake in and stack the lord's hay and it can be done in one day, and the work is worth a half penny. And he shall help to carry the said hay with a cart one horse or one man and the work is worth a half penny. And he shall winnow a bath of corn ["sarclabit bâd"], viz., two acres and a half as they lie and it is worth one farthing. And he shall carry the lord's under wood ["buscam"] with his neighbours, and if he carries trunk wood he shall have *per cartload* one piece of underwood which is called a faggot which he can lift with one hand and carry under his arm and if he carry branches or bushes he shall have one branch

as quittance for the reaping [“de liberacione messoris”]. Further he shall carry and he and his neighbour shall fetch with a cart victuals, hay, forage, timber, stones, tiles and other necessaries within the county when the lord’s wills, and if they pass the night out it shall be at the expense of the lord for that night and until he shall return home, and the said cartage of wood, victuals, timber and such-like is valued at ten pence a year. And he shall cart manure with his neighbours until the cartage be finished and the work is valued at sixpence. And he shall bring to the mill four bushels of corn in his own sack and take back thence the flour when the lord wishes and the work is valued at two pence with his own horse in his own sack four bushels of corn to market or elsewhere so that he can return the same day when the lord wishes; and he shall have four bushels one farthing and the work is worth two pence a year. And he shall make one hurdle in the wood with rods to the court or to the lord’s field and the work is valued at a half-penny, and he shall have for the making five rods. And he shall carry two hurdles for the sheep fold from one field to another when the lord wishes, and the work is worth one half penny. And he shall help to carry sheep and lambs to the water for washing and shall help to shear the sheep and lambs and the work is worth one penny. And on the feast of S. Martin [November 11th] he shall kill his own pigs which he has or had on the . . . of August, viz., for a pig of one year two pence for a pig of three-quarters of a year 1½d. for a pig of 6 months 1d. and for a weaned pig ½d., which ought to be put at the end of the roll for all tenants. And he shall carry forage and vetches when he ought to carry them for making into cocks or for threshing and the work is worth one half penny a yearly.

John atte Putte, Johanna Wonsom, Peter atte Mer', Alicia atte Putte, Juliana Gondick, and Agnes Cok.

COSHAM.

TENANTS AT WILL. *Julia relict of Wilfrid. de Cosham holds one messuage and ten acres of land and pays for the same yearly at the said feast . . . and for Salterne silver twelve pence farthing, and she comes for five days harvesting and she shall bind the corn and rake the hay and wash and shear the sheep and carry hurdles like Ralph atte Ryse.*

Alicia le Ray of Wymering holds one messuage and ten acres of land and pays for the same yearly on the said feast . . . and for Salterne silver, harvesting, binding of corn, haymaking, washing and shearing of sheep and carrying of hurdles, she shall pay and labour as much as the said Ralph atte Ryse.

N.B.—These two shall pay, labour and receive between them [“adinvicem”] in all and several other works as Ralph atte Ryse.

Tenants of *Bordland*, i.e. lands for the support of the lord's table :—

WYMERING.

Customary tenants and rental of the same.

William Smyht holds at Wymering one messuage, ten acres of land and pays for the same four shillings ten pence half penny on the feast of St. Michael ; and on the feast of S. Martin one cock. And for Salterne silver, harvesting, binding and carrying corn and hay, washing and shearing sheep and cartage of hurdles he shall pay and work the same as Ralph atte Ryse. And he shall find one man for stacking all the lord's corn, and he shall receive the same as Ralph for the cartage of the corn and the work is worth two pence. And he shall help to fill pits [“ curtas ”] with manure and the work is worth three pence per annum. And in all other particulars he shall pay, do and receive a moiety as Ralph atte Ryse except that he shall not cart corn nor manure nor [carry straw] nor vetches for stacking. And he shall stack straw, forage, and vetches, and the work is worth one half penny a year.

John Moriele holds one messuage and ten acres of land and pays for the same yearly at the feast of S. Michael five shillings, and in all several particulars he shall pay, do and receive the same as William Smyht.

Alice 'Garde' (a ward) holds one messuage and twelve acres of land and pays yearly for the same on the feast of S. Michael five shillings, and in all and several particulars [she shall pay] do and receive the same as the said William Smyht. The same Alice holds one piece of land in the said messuage and pays for the same yearly on the feast of S. Michael, one capon. The same Alice holds one acre of land called “ Lebut ” and pays for same yearly at Michaelmas half a pound of cummin.

Agnes, relict of Rene, holds one messuage and eight acres of land and pays for the same yearly on the feast of S. Michael eight shillings, and she pays for Salterne silver three pence and the fourth part of a farthing, viz., at the feast of S. Martin and at the feast of S. Martin one cock and three hens ; and at Easter ten eggs ; and she shall plough half an acre for wheat, and half an acre for oats, and shall

receive two pence, and the work is worth three pence clear. And she shall find two men for four harvestings, and she shall receive the same as any other and the work is worth eight pence. And she shall find one man for five harvestings, and the work is worth one penny. And she shall bind corn as any other and the work is worth three pence ; and she shall stack a moiety of corn as William Smyht, and the work is worth one penny halfpenny. And she shall help to stack straw, forage, vetches and hoth and furze that is to say a moiety like the said William Smyht, and the work is worth one half penny. And she shall rake in and stack hay, a moiety, as any other, and it is worth one farthing. And she shall help to fill the manure pits "pro medietate" as the said William Smith, and the work is worth one penny half penny.

John Clark holds one messuage and four acres of land and pays for the same yearly on the said feast of S. Michael two shillings and three pence. And in all and severa particulars he shall pay, do and receive the same as Agnes la Réné except that he shall not find more than one man for five harvestings. Further he shall harrow two acres, and it is worth two pence. And he shall wash and shear sheep as any other, and it is worth two pence.

Alexander Rene holds one messuage and four acres of land and pays for the same annually three shillings at the said feast of S. Michael. And he shall pay, do and receive in all and several the same as Robert Clark except that he shall not pay a cock or hen nor shall wash or shear sheep.

John Joppe holds one messuage and four acres of land and pays for the same yearly on the said feast three shillings and six pence. And in all and several he shall pay, do and receive the same as the said Alexander le Réné.

Richard atte Croft holds one messuage and ten acres of land and was wont to pay and do for the same and for ten acres which Thomas le Boteler now holds as a tenant for life in all and several particulars as the said Ralph atte

Ryse. And now he shall not pay yearly on the feast of S. Michael . . . shillings. And for Salterne silver twelve pence farthing as the said Ralph atte Ryse.

Roger Golafre holds one messuage and ten acres of land and meadow and pays for the same yearly on the feast of S. Michael four shillings and nine pence. And he shall find one man for three harvestings and it is worth three pence.

Note 1.—The above deed is undated; but from the character of the script and from internal evidence it may be placed in the first quarter of the xivth century, i.e., temp. Edward II.

Note 2.—The particulars of the tenancy of *Ralph atte Ryse*, given in full above, may evidently be regarded as typical of the villein tenures on this manor.
