ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1919.

READ AT WINCHESTER, 21ST APRIL, 1920.

The Committee much regret to have to record the death of Miss Minns, which took place soon after the last Annual Meeting, and not very long after the death of the Rev. G. W. Minns, F.S.A. Miss Minns was an old member of the Club, and one whose activities in connection with it will long be remembered. The death of Sir William St. John Hope, in August last, has removed from the list of Honorary Members a famous name and a personality of whom many of our members will retain pleasant memories. In years past he often served as our guide when visiting the excavations at Silchester, and also met us at Old Sarum. His many and varied writings are too well known to need enumeration. While his special affection was given to mediæval antiquities, there were few branches of archæological and antiquarian research of which he did not acquire a competent working knowledge, and his sound judgment and advice was always at the service of students who invoked his help. His comprehensive acquaintance with mediæval England was fortified by a remarkably tenacious and accurate memory and by a power of classifying and co-ordinating everything that came under his observation. He was an invaluable source of reference. To lay before him some problem arising from the plan or contents of an ancient building was, in nine cases out of ten, to find that he could cite some instance which bore so nearly upon the case in point that the inquirer was put at once upon the right track of investigation.

During 1919 seven meetings were held, three of which were entirely devoted to the study of Science and of Nature.

Special thanks are due to Mr. H. L. Hawkins, F.G.S., of Reading University, and to Mr. R. W. Hooley, F.G.S., for supplying geological information at these meetings.

The meetings were as follows :—At Lainstone, May 28th ; the Vale of Kingsclere, June 14th ; Romsey, July 7th ; the Vale of Chilcomb, July 15th ; The Isle of Wight, August 21st ; Pylewell Park, September 18th ; Winchester Museum, November 26th.

The Committee tender their respectful thanks to Mr. and Mrs. Hautenville Cope, Colonel Wilfred Ashley, M.P., Mr. W. Ingham Whitaker, D.L., J.P., and Mr. R. W. Hooley, F.G.S., who kindly provided hospitality. Mr. Ingham Whitaker also provided conveyances for the party from and to Lymington. The Committee also wish to record their thanks to Mr. I. B. Healing, who places his office at their disposal.

The publication of the Proceedings has been placed in new hands with satisfactory results, and although, owing to the increased cost of printing, a part was not issued during 1919, a part for 1919 and 1920 is now in the hands of members.

At the Annual Meeting of the Hampshire Field Club on April 18th, 1921, another Editor having been elected to supersede me, I take this opportunity of thanking those ladies and gentlemen who have helped me during the eight years of difficult editorship owing to wartime and the fact that the Proceedings had ceased publication.

I have done everything I could to promote the interest and welfare of the Club in my own County and met with much help and support. To all these I tender most sincere thanks in this my farewell preface.
